### **Ash – Miss Peck and Mrs Campbell:**

This week we finished our topic by learning about unusual plants. We read the story of 'Elizabite, the Carnivorous Plant' and made up our own unusual plants. ### **Birch – Mrs Lovett and Mrs Lione:**

We have enjoyed our wonderful wildlife topic and all the learning we have done. This week we wrote a fact sheet about our own chosen animal. We brainstormed what we wanted to find out and researched it on the internet and in our non-fiction books. We have put our fact sheets together to make a non-fiction book called wonderful wildlife. We made sure that it had a contents page, an index and a glossary!

In numeracy we have had great fun exploring capacity using standard measures.

- Literacy – To identify the features of non-fiction writing.
- Numeracy – To begin to estimate and measure capacity.



### **Hazel – Mrs Stepney:**

This week we have been writing explanation texts. We researched how birds nest and raise their Chicks and then produced a class explanation as both a book and a PowerPoint. We then compared the two and discussed which we thought was the best way of presenting explanations and why.

In Science we dissected lilies so that we could investigate all the different parts of a flower.

We hope you have a relaxing half term and look forwards to seeing all the children for our trip to Wandlebury on Monday 3rd June.

### **Oak – Mrs Nussey and Mrs Robichaud:**


