


Birch – Mrs Lovett and Mrs Lione:

We have enjoyed our measuring, comparing more than two lengths when we sorted some scarves and comparing more than two heights when we put ourselves in height order.

We estimated and then recorded our estimates, finding objects that were longer than 3 pens and then shorter than 3 pens. We had fun playing our 'Guess the length' game. We have learnt a lot of mathematical measuring language.

- Literacy – The next part of the Nativity story, sentence structure, handwriting practise and illustrating.
- Numeracy – Measuring.



Hazel – Mrs Stepney:

This week we have used story mountains to help us plan and then write our time travelling stories. We have used a map of the UK to plot London and Haslingfield. We also plotted other places in the UK that we have visited.

We created mind maps to identify the differences and similarities between London and Haslingfield. We compared photographs from our trip to London and ones of Haslingfield to remind us of what the buildings and surroundings look like.

- Literacy – To use a story mountain to plan for writing. To write a story. To use different sentence openers.
- Numeracy – To gather and represent data as Venn diagrams, Carroll diagrams and block graphs. To interpret data from graphs and charts.

Hawthorn – Miss Wernham:

We have been getting into the festive spirit already by making beautiful Christmas photo frames for the fair – please look out for them today!

In Science we have been investigating how and why solids melt, using coloured ice and a variety of different methods to 'accelerate' melting. We have also been examining nets of 3D solids in maths and DT, in preparation for our 'packaging' project.

- Literacy – To write and act out scenes from plays.
- Numeracy – To solve one and two-step word problems involving addition and subtraction.



Oak – Mrs Nussey and Mrs Wells:

In Literacy we have examined simple non-chronological reports and suggested improvements to them. We then completed 'sandwich sentences' as we studied the use of subordinate clauses. Finally, we incorporated topic sentences into paragraphs and considered possible subjects for our final reports, which we will complete using Publisher. Gym with Mr Brennan was challenging once more as we all tried to build rolls, using accurate shapes and body position, into our sequences. We planned and carried out a fair test in science this week using hot water, thermometers, big cups and different material for wrapping the cups to find out which would be the best thermal conductor. We also have a mystery in our classroom. Snowmen have started appearing in different areas of the room, but we don't know who is leaving them there. We intend to solve this mystery by Christmas!

- Literacy – Examining the structure of a non-chronological report.
- Numeracy – Reading analogue and digital time.



Beech – Mrs Creamer:

Having enjoyed visiting the crime scene in Literacy last week, we have been working hard to write our journalistic reports. Our first drafts are looking good. We have yet to complete our designs for adverts for Stibbington and write the final few sentences of the report which point to the future. In ICT we have begun to explore the possibilities of Publisher so that we can turn our articles into newspaper front covers. In Maths we have been looking at 2D and 3D shapes, identifying their properties and classifying them. We have examined the results of our thermal insulators experiment and written our conclusions. While some of us took part in the cross-country competition the rest of us attempted to 'Explain Christmas to an alien!'
