- Numeracy – To understand and use ordinal language up to 20.




Hazel – Mrs Stepney:

Happy New Year and welcome back to the new term. On Tuesday we received an exciting package that contained a bear called Augustus who had brought with him lots of clues to help us work out what we will be learning about this term. Our theme for this term is ‘dig, dig, dig’ and we will be finding out all about farming in the past, today and in another country. We then thought of questions about farming we would like to find the answers to and we set to work straight away and sowed some cress seeds. We have created a patchwork field backdrop for our display in the classroom, using our colour mixing skills.

- Literacy – To use a thesaurus to expand vocabulary choices. To use connectives in writing.
- Numeracy – To compare and measure capacity in litres and millilitres. To read a scale.

We have had a fun start to our topic by researching where our ancestors are from. We have shared what we know about Ancient Rome and what we want to find out. - Literacy – To examine features of Newspapers.
- Numeracy – To use basic strategies to aid addition. To learn the column method of addition.



Oak – Mrs Nussey:

After a relaxing Christmas holiday we have all bounced back into Oak Class with energy and enthusiasm. This week we have made our own Oak Class jigsaw, choosing elements of our individual characters to write on each piece. We have discovered our new topic of ‘Japan – Samurai, Shogun and Sushi’, using a museum box containing an original woven basket and four pairs of ‘geta’ which are shoes a bit like our flip-flops. We have celebrated New Year (‘oshogatsu’) by playing a Japanese ‘pin the features on the face’ game and making New Year cards. The Little Theatre in our room changes every day and is inspiring us to write our own stories based on the changing action and characters. The Pizzas we made for beginning our learning in fractions had some strange toppings, from frogspawn to just plain hot chilli.
