Birch – Mrs Lovett and Mrs Lione:

In Numeracy this week we have looked at different ways we can collect data. We looked at our pictogram showing our favourite Ice Age characters and then thought about other data we could collect. We decided to find out about our favourite ice cream and our favourite animals. We made a tally chart to collect the information and then a pictogram and a block graph to show the information. Then we asked questions and found the answers about them.

On Friday it was Bun Day so we worked independently in our groups to show data about our favourite cakes.

It was great to see so many parents in on Monday for Oak Class 'Show and Tell'. Thank you. The children have written about and illustrated posters of the ecosystem we discovered in the school garden. Our science investigation of organisms and biodiversity lead to enquiry about life cycles of newts, the diet of sticklebacks and the classification of woodlice as a crustacean. In our study of Japan we were examining the feudal system in the Heian Era, which involved The Emperor, Shoguns, Samurai and peasants.
