Ash – Miss Peck and Mrs Hollins:

This week we have been learning all about the story of Jack and the beanstalk. We have produced some fantastic writing thinking about what we would like to see at the top of the beanstalk, the children had some very imaginative ideas! We listened to different versions of the story, and worked hard at sequencing the story in the right order. We had to help Jack build a number beanstalk as the wind kept blowing it away. We were very impressed with the children's number knowledge this week, they have been working very hard on their targets. We designed our own magic beans they are very colourful and sparkly and on display for you all to see. We were very lucky to have a visit from a drama group this week, we all really enjoyed it and the children took part with enthusiasm. Well done Ash class. We have been enjoying the lovely sunshine this week in Ash class and have been spending lots of time in our outdoor classroom exploring and making lots of noise with our urban music maker!

- Literacy – sequencing stories, story writing.
- Numeracy – number recognition, writing numbers, less than/more than.



Birch – Mrs Campbell and Mrs Lione:

This week we read the book *Mrs Armitage, Queen of the Road* as inspiration for designing and making our own cars. We recalled the events and order of the story and wrote about what we would like to be king or queen of. We thought very carefully about our model cars, what they might look like, what we would need to make them and how we would put it all together. Next week we are going to evaluate our work! We enjoyed a special drama session on Wednesday and have been busy practising for our dance which we are sharing at Comberton next week. We've had some messy maths lessons learning about capacity and pouring water and sand all over the classroom!

- Literacy – Planning writing before we start

Hazel – Miss Hall:

This week in Hazel class we have been planning and beginning to write our own Horrid Henry story. We have listened to a variety of Horrid Henry stories and we are drawing on these to help us in our writing. We have also used junk modelling to create versions of our gadgets for Horrid Henry. In Maths, we have been looking at fractions, including halves, quarters and thirds. We have also been creating some Mother's Day gifts.

- Literacy - To plan a story and to select interesting vocabulary to use. To begin to write a story. To use paragraphs in writing.
- Maths – To recognise and find fractions of objects, numbers and of a whole. To be familiar with halves and quarters.

Show and tell (Weds) – Charlotte and Charlie

Hawthorn – Miss Turner:

We have had a busy week in Hawthorn class this week.

In Literacy we have been learning about Information Texts. We have started learning about what is needed for a paragraph. We have been researching a chosen theme based on our topic, 'Making Waves.' The children will be making PowerPoint presentations using this research. In numeracy the children have been learning about place value. We have been multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100 and learning about positive and negative numbers. In science we have learnt about echos and also learnt a little bit of sign language. As part of our topic work we have designed a water wheel, which we will be making in the last week of term. If you have any recyclable materials we can use to make these please send them in (no glass or tin cans.)

- Literacy – To start organizing writing in paragraphs.
- Numeracy – To multiply and divide by 10 and 100. To multiply and divide by 10 and 100 using 1-place decimals.



Oak – Miss Wernham:

This week we have had great fun practising our Egyptian Assembly – we hope you enjoyed it. We have almost finished our Artisans tombs – they still require a mummy and some artistic details. In PSHE we have been talking about risk and what sort of things are riskier than others.

- Literacy – To make notes about Cairo.
- Numeracy – To find the area and perimeter of rectangles.



Beech – Mrs Hughes:

In numeracy this week we focused on the properties of different 2D and 3D shapes. From shapes, the focus moved to the angles within closed objects, then measuring and drawing angles with a protractor. The children revised a wide variety of mathematical language surrounding shapes.

Our literacy focus is leading into the children's final assessment of a persuasive text. The focus again was to identify the different types of language used, and for what purpose. We will finish the week learning how to research factual information to use in their persuasive text.

With two weeks remaining we are continuing on with homework, which is due on Wednesday's, until the end of the term.

- Literacy - Identify the structure of a persuasive text.
- Numeracy – Understand how to estimate first, and then measure angles using a protractor.
