The children produced their first piece of writing in their work books this week and wrote about what happens during autumn time. They thought carefully about the way they formed their letters and worked hard on their finger spaces; we even talked about full stops too! ### **Birch – Miss Hall:**

This week in Birch class we have been recapping this half term's work on number, addition and subtraction. We have practised using joining words such as 'and' and 'because' in our Literacy writing. We have been looking at the designs of pumpkin lanterns and deciding which ones we liked best. We then used these to help us to write about and design our own pumpkin lantern. We then made a model of this lantern, using modrock.

- Literacy: To use joining words such as and.
- Maths: To add and subtract numbers to 20 and above.



### **Hazel – Mrs Campbell and Mrs Lione:**

This week we have read the story of the Man on the Moon and his work there! We have enjoyed recounting it and recalling all the details. We have started making our own pom-pom planets and they are looking great. We have been testing materials in science and had lots of fun trying to twist, stretch, squash and bend various objects. The presentations this week have continued to be of a really high standard and its been lovely finding out more about everyone's interests.

Our Big Write after half term will be about a trip on a spaceship/rocket so lots of opportunity for talking and research over the holiday! We hope you all have a restful break.

### **Hawthorn – Miss Turner:**

Hawthorn have had a busy week. In Literacy the children have written a non-chronological report on the Stone Age, Bronze or Iron Age. The children were encouraged to use a range of punctuation and connectives within their writing. In numeracy the children have continued learning about multiplication and division. They have learnt how to use array to help them multiply and divide. They have also been learning to round remainders, when solving word problems. The children have continued learning about the Iron Age and have learnt about how an iron age round house is made. They enjoyed sharing what they remember about the round house we sat in during our trip this week. In science the children have planned and carried out an investigation into soil permeability.

- Literacy - To write a non-chronological report, using punctuation and connectives correctly.
- Numeracy - To multiply and divide using arrays.



### **Oak – Ms Wernham:**

In Science this week we have conducted an investigation on thermal insulation, with some surprising results! During our topic afternoons we have investigated different types of castles, in preparation for our model-making next half term. We finished this week by making cookies – random but lovely!

- Literacy – To edit and improve grammar and punctuation in extended pieces of writing
- Numeracy – To find all factors of 2 digit numbers



### **Beech – Mrs Petty:**

This week, we have researched and presented information about the Home Guard and the Land Girls from World War Two. We also used Mod-roc to create our own Home Guard helmets which we will be wearing to our class assembly. In Literacy, we considered the emotions involved in the attack on Pearl Harbour, hot seating each other in character as American soldiers who survived, other citizens and British officers. Making notes from the responses and trying to echo the way in which these people might have responded, we presented the facts and opinions in a newspaper report. In Maths, we applied our understanding about all four operations to fractions. We used the 'bar model' to help us and also practised these skills on Mathletics. To end the week, we completed an assessment on all the Maths we have covered so far this term and then discussed the solutions.

- Literacy: to use direct and reported speech as well as biased language in a newspaper report.
- Maths: adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing with fractions
