### **Ash – Miss Peck and Mrs Hollins:**

We have had a very busy and exciting week in Ash class this week. On Monday our chick eggs arrived in their incubator and we all wrote lists about the kinds of things we will need to make sure we can look after them properly. ### **Birch – Mrs Campbell:**

This week in Birch class we have continued to think about the seaside and talked about the features of seascides we had visited. We then added some features to a seaside background. We read stories about Katie Morag who lives on an island and wrote about adventures with a magic sandcastle. In science we looked at grouping animals into birds, reptiles, mammals etc and found some examples of each. We've been learning about multiplication in maths using pictures, objects and arrays.

### **Hazel – Mrs Lione and Mrs Lovett:**

This Week in Hazel class we have continued to learn more about our Under the Sea topic. We have been locating and talking about beaches around the UK and sharing where we have visited. We have been busy creating a wall frieze of the seaside using a range of art techniques. Year 1 had a fantastic time at Comberton at the Multi skills event. In Science we have looked at life cycles and designed dials to show the life cycle of a butterfly and a frog.

- Literacy: Writing our own stories about a sea creature that gets lost. To use joining words.
- Numeracy: Measuring capacity. Adding and taking away in 10's

### **Hawthorn – Miss Turner:**

This week has been a busy week in Hawthorn class. In Literacy the children have been learning about Explanation texts and have read examples to identify the features. The children have also been learning about tense. They have learned how to add 'ed' to verbs to make them past tense and have also learnt about the perfect present tense (things that have happened in the past but are still happening now.) In Numeracy the children have been learning about time and have been reading times on analogue and digital clocks both 12hr and 24 hrs. The children have also been learning about AM and PM and have been estimating time. In Science the children have been learning about friction and carried out an experiment to see which surface provided the most/least friction to stop a car. The children were asked to record their results and identify which surface was best and explain why. This week in topic the children have been learning about some of the geographical wonders of North America and have written an information leaflet about some of their favourites.

- Literacy – To use past and present tense of verbs.
- Numeracy- To convert times from 12hr to 24hr digital clocks.



### **Oak – Ms Wernham:**

It's been a very busy week this week. We have had two Indian drumming sessions which were loud but absolutely fantastic, plus another tennis session with Jamie which was great fun.

During our topic session we mapped countries that bordered India and created diagrams to show the importance of the river to the Indus Valley civilization.

- Literacy – to practice using the subjunctive verb form in formal writing
- Numeracy – to solve problems involving fractions and percentages



### **Beech – Mrs Petty:**

This week, the children started their Athletics unit (all the elements of the decathlon) with Mr Segrave. In Science with Ms Linsdell, the children recapped their understanding of classification and in Spanish the focus was vocabulary around meal times. In Art, the children started their work on our topic - the developing community- considering and sketching the types of architecture that exist in our village and the surrounding area. During English and Maths, the class have been solving and discussing a variety of mixed questions in preparation for next week when the Year 6 pupils will have mock SATs and the Year 5 pupils will have their own assessments. In our Big write session, we wrote a biography about the Queen, in light of her 90th birthday.

- Literacy: to identify and use features of formality (no contractions, use the passive voice, use an impersonal tone and the subjunctive)
- Maths: use of divisibility rules and converting between metric units and imperial ones.
