Vocabulary, Grammar and Punctuation

- Punctuation of bullet points to list information How hyphens can be used to avoid ambiguity

- Select appropriate vocabulary and language effects, appropriate to task, audience and purpose, for precision and impact.
- Select appropriate register for formal and informal purposes.
- Make conscious technique choices to engage the reader- e.g., tone, style. Blend action, dialogue and description within and across paragraphs. Use dialogue to convey character

- Use devices to build cohesion within a paragraph (e.g. then, after that, this, firstly) Linking ideas across paragraphs using adverbials of time), place) and number.
- Linking ideas across paragraphs using a wider range of cohesive devices: repetition of a word or phrase, grammatical connections

Writing

- Blend action, dialogue and description within and across paragraphs.
- Use dialogue to convey character and advance the action
- Consciously control the use of different sentence structures for effect, drawing on techniques used by authors
- Combine text types to create hybrid texts- e.g., a persuasive report.
- Assess the effectiveness of their own and others' writing in relation to audience and purpose, suggesting and making changes to enhance effects and clarify meaning.
- Proofread for grammar, spelling and punctuation
